**2008 Senate Bills Signed By Governor Kulongoski  
March 11, 2008**

**SB 1061**

Requires Department of Human Services (DHS) to work with stakeholders to create a plan to improve long term care services.

**SB 1066**

Specifies up to \$350,000 from State School Fund may be spent for administration and support of talented and gifted (TAG) education. Requires waiver of tuition at Oregon University System institutions and Oregon Health and Sciences University for child, spouse, or unremarried surviving spouse of service member under certain circumstances. Requires waiver for qualified student pursuing baccalaureate or master's degree. Provides maximum waiver term. Declares emergency, effective upon passage.

**SB 1068**

Requires school districts to offer half-day kindergarten free of charge. Requires public charter school, if it offers kindergarten, to offer half-day kindergarten. Permits school districts and public charter schools to offer and charge tuition for supplemental kindergarten.

**SB 1071**

Requires out-of-state contributions appear in different colored font than in-state contributions on electronic filing system. Requires treasurers for initiatives, referenda or recall petitions to file contribution and expenditure transactions no later than April 1, 2008 for certain transactions. Adjusts ORESTAR reporting deadlines from midnight to 11:59 p.m. Allows a candidate or political committee to email a contributor asking them to furnish their occupation if they didn't do so when making a contribution.

**SB 1072**

Increases the penalty for participating in dog fighting from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class C felony. Increases the penalty for possessing dog fighting paraphernalia from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class C felony.

**SB 1074**

Requires the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District (TriMet) to perform evaluations of criminal activity occurring on or near the light rail system, of operational safety, and of personal safety and security of light rail passengers. It directs TriMet to

report annually to the Legislative Assembly regarding light rail safety evaluations. It is repealed January 2, 2012. Declares emergency, effective upon passage.

**SB 1079**

Requires issue of cardlock cards to provide the Department of Transportation with fuel tax information and to collect and remit fuel taxes when cardlock card holders purchase fuel at a retail facility that has an attended portion equipped with a cardlock card reader. Allows retail, nonretail and wholesale dealers to sell gasoline unblended with ethanol for use in motor vehicles designed for off-road use and for tools.

**SB 1081**

Updates Oregon's date of connection to federal income tax laws from December 31, 2006 to December 31, 2007.

**SB 1082**

Requires the Department of Revenue to submit report to the Legislature on individual taxpayer compliance no later than February 1, 2009.

**SB 1084**

Allows pedestrians to move onto a roadway, or proceed along a roadway, with permit from applicable road authority. Permits road authorities to issue permits to move onto or proceed along roadways.

**SB 1086**

Clarifies that a public safety officer may request that the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training not disclose the officer's home address and telephone number and requires that, if so requested, the department not disclose this information unless the public interest requires otherwise.

**SB 1088**

Clarifies that a juvenile court has the same authority to suspend the driving privileges of a juvenile offender that a circuit court has for an adult offender. Effective upon passage.

**SB 1092**

Requires person filing petition when youth first makes an appearance before court alleging jurisdiction in juvenile court to notify youth's resident superintendent, superintendent's designee, or, if known to prosecutor that youth is in a private or charter school, the principal of that school within 15 days from petition filing.

**SB 1093**

Requires transfer of SB 329 (2007) General Fund appropriation from Department of Human Services to the Oregon Health Fund, and increases Other Funds expenditure limitation for the Oregon Health Fund Board.

**SB 1095**

Requires a court to set a security release at a minimum of \$500,000 for a person awaiting trial for certain methamphetamine drug crimes, if the court finds probable cause to believe the defendant committed the crime and there is a danger the defendant will: (a) fail to appear in court; (b) commit a new crime; or (c) pose a threat to the public.

**SB 1098**

Requires voter registration cards be addressed to an elections official if the registration arrives after the 21st day before an election. Deletes the requirement that voters must request a ballot after they change their voter registration within 21 days prior to an election.

**SB 1101**

Clarifies language pertaining to the withholding of income taxes for certain real estate transactions.

**SB 5555**
