## American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Delivering for Oregon

***\$1 Billion Spent:*** In the first six months of implementation, the state has obligated or spent approximately \$1 billion – or 25% – of the \$3.9 billion in total funds expected to flow through the state during the three-year program.

***Special Reporting Requirements:*** Of the \$1 billion, the state has submitted data as required under section 1512 of the Recovery Act for a total of \$269 million in spending for nearly 400 awards.

***Thousands of Jobs Created:*** More than the equivalent of 8,000 full time jobs have been created or retained as a result of \$269 million in investments.

### **Education – K-12 and Postsecondary**

***\$466 million in education:*** A total of \$466 million in Recovery Act funding was directed to education – both k-12 and post-secondary – for the 07-09 and 09-11 budgets.

- Helped preserve the equivalent of 20 schools days for K-12 for the 08-09 and 09-10 school years.
- Retained and created more than 4,000 education jobs in K-12 and the state's seven public universities

### **Direct Assistance to Oregonians**

***\$750 million in direct assistance:*** Over \$750 million in Recovery Act funding is in the hands of individual Oregonians to help families meet their basic needs.

- Approximately \$360 million in extended unemployment payments is helping thousands of Oregonians seeking a job.
- More than \$67 million dollars in food stamp assistance has helped the state continue to serve approximately 300,000 Oregon households each month.
- To date about \$350 million has already made it possible to provide healthcare to Oregonians though Medicaid.

### **Public Safety**

***\$100 million for prisons:*** Approximately \$100 million invested to help keep state prisons operating.

- More than 1000 full time jobs were preserved through this investment.

### **Transportation**

***Hundreds of projects:*** Approximately \$234 million invested in 230 transportation projects statewide to repair roads and bridges.

- More than 250,000 hours of transportation work has been generated through Recovery Act investments since February.
- Over 5000 transportation job opportunities were created in the month of August alone.
